

**Fred Altmann**  
**May 25, 1894 - April 21, 1968**  
**Fred Altmann Stricken at 73**

A retired farmer, Fred Altman, 73, of 1502 28th Ave., Monroe, died at 7:20 p.m. Sunday, April 21, in St. Clare Hospital. He had been a medical patient there since April 11 and had had a series of strokes.

He was a lifelong Green County resident, born in Washington Township May 25, 1894, a son of Jacob and Margaretha Marty Altmann. He was married Feb. 15, 1917 to Elizabeth S. Steiner in the Swiss Reformed Church parsonage at New Glarus, with the late Rev. G. D. Elliker officiating.

He farmed in Mt. Pleasant Township, just north of the village of Monticello for 41 years, retiring to Monroe on Feb. 25, 1958. The couple observed their golden wedding anniversary in 1967 with an open house in Fellowship Hall of Zwingli United Church of Christ in Monticello.

Surviving are his widow, Elizabeth; a daughter, Miss Dorothy; three brothers, Theodore, Henry and William Altmann and a sister, Mrs. Albert (Margaret) Heinzelman, all of Monroe.

He was preceded in death by a daughter, Elizabeth, in 1936; two sisters, Ottillia in 1926, and Mrs. Robert (Ella) Weiss in 1949, and two brothers, Jakob Jr., in 1936, and one in infancy. His father died April 30, 1952, and his mother, Jan. 26, 1939.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday, April 24, in Zwingli Church, Monticello, where he was a member. Rev. J. Allen Mittler, pastor, is to officiate. Interment will be in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
