Mrs. Anna Baebler, Village Resident of Half Century, Dies Passes Away in Home of Daughter; Conduct Last Rite

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Baebler, 80 years of age, a resident of Monticello for half a century, who passed away Thursday in the home of a daughter, Mrs. John Buehler, Orangeville, Ill, were conducted at 1:30 Sunday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home and at 2 in the Zwingli Reformed church.

Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, officiated. Burial was in the Railroad avenue cemetery. Pallbearers, all nephews, were as follows: Wm. Pagel, Jr., Abraham Kubly, John H. Baebler, and John C. Babler, Monticello; John Baebler, Milwaukee, and C. W. Freitag, Chicago.

Native of Switzerland

Anna Baebler, a daughter of Vincent and Marie Stauffacher Baebler, was born Jan. 21, 1859, in Canton Glarus, Switzerland. She obtained her education in her native country and was married to Peter Baebler Oct. 14, 1875, the ceremony taking place in Switzerland. The couple came to America in 1886 and settled in Monticello. Mr. Baebler died of heart failure in 1902.

Mrs. Baebler had always made her home in Monticello with the exception of brief visit to her children at various points. She had been ill since last fall, at which time she went to Orangeville to make her home with her daughter.

Mrs. Baebler was a member of the Zwingli Reformed and Evangelical church.

Survivors are three daughters, Mrs. John Buehler and Mrs. Lloyd Clark, Orangeville, and Mrs. Anna Snyder, Janesville; one son, Peter J. Baebler, Monroe; two brothers, John Baebler, Sr., Monticello, and Vincent Baebler, Mt. Pleasant 'township; three sisters, Mrs. Maria Kubly, Monticello, Mrs. Henry F. Freitag, Monroe, and Mrs. Barbara Pagel, Freeport, and three grandchildren.
