Mrs. Jacob Baehler Dies at Age of 87

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Baehler, 87 years of age, former Monticello resident, who died at 2:10 a.m. Monday at the New Glarus Home, were held at 1:30 Wednesday afternoon in the Zwingli church Memorial Lounge.

The Rev. Charles G. Workman, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were John C. Elmer and John L. Streiff, Monticello, James E. Farmer, Monroe, Richard A. Kubly, Sr., Richard A. Kubly, Jr., Janesville, and Lee Patterson, Brooklyn.

Mrs. Baehler had been in failing health for several weeks and died unexpectedly as the result of a stroke.

She was born in Burgestein, Canton Berne, Switzerland, Aug. 28, 1884, the daughter of Johann and Anna Baehler Kohler. She was educated in Switzerland and was married there on Feb. 8, 1906, to Jacob Baehler. The couple came to the United States in 1908, settling at Monticello, Iowa, living there until 1921, when they came to Monticello, Wis. Mr. Baehler, a stone mason and bricklayer by trade, died April 10, 1951.

In 1962 Mrs. Baehler sold her home here and for eight years lived with her daughters in Madison and Monroe. Since April, 1970, she had resided at the New Glarus Home.

She is survived by one son, Alfred Baehler, Rapid City, S. D.; two daughters, Mrs. A. Henry (Caroline) Kubly, Monroe, and Mrs. Robert (Helen) Wille, 3609 Sargent St., Madison; one sister, Mrs. Margaret Stucki, in Switzerland; seven grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.

Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by four sisters.
