

## **Joseph Bartlett**

**Aug. 3, 1890 - Sept. 15, 1973**

ALBANY (Times Special) — Joseph M. Bartlett, 83, lifelong Attica-Albany resident, died Saturday morning, Sept. 15, in the home of his sister, Mrs. George (May) Kittleson. He had been in ill health for sometime.

Mr. Bartlett, a retired farmer since 1954, was born at Attica Aug. 3, 1890, a son of Chauncey and Anna Maynard Bartlett. He attended Attica school.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Kittleson, with whom he had been making his home recently, and Mrs. Harry (Grace) Edwards, also of Albany.

He was preceded in death by two brothers, Percy Bartlett, Danvers, Minn., March 6, 1971, and Romayn (Roe), Oct. 1, 1962. His father died March 27, 1930, and his mother, in April, 1924.

Services for Mr. Bartlett were at 1:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 17, in Gohlke-Sharer Funeral Home. Rev. Oscar Stanke of the United Methodist Church officiated.

Mrs. T. E. Sharer was organist playing, "Whispering Hope," "How Great Thou Art," and "The Old Rugged Cross." Burial was in Attica Cemetery. Pallbearers were Nelson Petersen, Wayne Albertson Sr., Namon Heffner, Edward Oliver, Herbert Striker, and Arnold Reasa.
