Dr. C. Benkendorf, Age 49, Green Bay, Stricken Saturday

Dr. Charles Benkendorf, 49. years of age, 408 St. Francis Drive, Green Bay, a former Monticello doctor, died Saturday afternoon in a hospital there.

Born June 19, 1922, in Milwaukee, the son of Charles and Frances Benkendorf, he attended pre-medical school at Carroll College, Waukesha, and was graduated from Marquette University Medical School and interned at Milwaukee County General Hospital. He served his residency in radiology at University Hospitals in Madison and was a general practitioner in Monticello for six years.

While in school, Dr, Benkendorf was a member of Beta Pi Epsilon, Alpha Sigma Nu, honor-fraternity and Phi Chi, social fraternity.
