Rites Held Sunday for Albert E. Blum, Age 63, Native of Village

Funeral services for Albert E. Blum, 63, Washington, D. C., a native of Monticello, who died at 5:40 a. m, last Thursday at the North Shore hospital, Miami, Fla., after a short illness, were held at 2 Sunday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Swiss church cemetery, New Glarus.

Pallbearers were Dr. Fred G. Blum, Jr., Henry W. Harris, Jr., and Adam A. Schuler, Madison, Jerome Grunet, Brooklyn, Orton Johnson, Portage, and Elliott Sweet, Verona.

Mr. Blum had been in Monticello just two months ago for the funeral of his wife and had remained in Madison for several weeks, returning to Washington just recently. Due to illness he had gone to Miami just the Saturday preceding his death.

Mr. Blum was born in Monticello March 13, 1900, the son of Edward J. and Anna Schindler Blum. He attended the Monticello high school and was a graduate of the University of Wisconsin School of Commerce. On July 16, 1927, he was married at Rockford, Ill., to Selma Waage, They lived in Madison and Milwaukee and in 1939 moved to Philadelphia, Pa. Six years later they moved to Washington, D. C., where he was associated with the Federal Securities Exchange Commission. More recently he had been a valuation expert in the Internal Revenue Service with the U. S. Treasury department.

He is survived by his mother, Mrs, Anna Blum, Miami, Fla.; one brother, Fred G. Blum, Madison; and two sisters. Mrs. E. P. McKinney and Mrs. Herman E. Theiler, Miami, Fla. He was preceded in death by his wife, Nov. 30, 1963, one brother, Otto, Aug. 9, 1961, and his father in 1937.

Frederick S. Voegeli motored to O'Hare Field, Chicago, Friday for the body of Mr. Blum, which arrived there by jet plane from Miami.
