## ARTHUR C. BOSS

Arthur C. Boss, 65, 229 S. Garfield, Monticello, died unexpectedly on Monday, June 14, 1976, of an apparent heart attack, suffered shortly after beginning work at the Monticello High School, early Monday morning. He was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Clare Hospital where he was taken by ambulance.

He was born in Sylvester Township, Green County, on Oct. 20, 1910, the son of Gottlieb and Elisa Wuetrich Boss. He received his education in Buckskin Rural School, Washington Township, and was married Oct. 4, 1940, in the East Wiota Lutheran Church, to Margaret E. Krueger. They farmed in Mt. Schwartzlow, all of Monticello; one brother, John Boss, Rt. 4, Monroe; two sisters, Mrs. Leland (Ella) Kubly, Monroe, and Mrs. Louise Bidlingmaier, now a resident of Pleasant View, Monroe, and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Margaret, in March 19, 1976; his parents, and three brothers, Fred, killed in. World War I action, Edwin, 1967, and Albert, 1972.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, June 16, at 1:30 p.m. in the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, where he was a member. His pastor, Rev. Charles G. Workman, officiated and interment was in Highland Cemetery.
