Amber Viola Lewis, youngest daughter of Theophilus Lewis and wife, was born October 12, 1898 in the town of Mt. Pleasant, Green county, Wisconsin, and died at her home near Albany, Wisconsin, April 2, 1927, at the age of 28 years, 5 months and 20 days.

February 8, 1922, she was united in marriage to Dempster J. Davis, who survives her.

To this union were born two children, a son, Nelson Ray, who preceded her in death and a little four year old daughter, Miriam Elaine. Besides her husband and daughter she is survived by her parents; three brothers: Lloyd of Evansville, Duane of Albany, and Frank who is at home; two sister: Mrs. Theo. Martindale and Mrs. Ava Wood of Albany and many other relatives and friends. After completing school, she attended Green County Normal.
