MRS. STANLEY DIETZ DIES

End Comes to Native of Attica Following Stroke

Browntown.—Mrs. Stanley Dietz, aged 41, a life-long respected resident of Green, county, passed away at her home here at 4 o'clock this morning. Mrs. Dietz suffered a stroke three years ago and since that time she has been an invalid. Another stroke on Wednesday hastened the end.

Sarah Melvina, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Qualley, was born Oct. 29, 1881, in Exeter township. On June 14, 1899, she was married to Stanley Dietz in the same township.

She had always lived in Green county and was a resident of Monroe for many years. Five years ago the family moved to Browntown where they have since resided.

Mrs. Dietz was a member of the Eastern Star at Albany, and of the Methodist church, in which she took active part. An ambitious woman and an ideal mother, Mrs. Dietz was greatly beloved and her extended illness and death brings great sadness to the family and many friends.

Besides the widower she is survived by three children, one daughter and two sons: Mrs. Norris Burrington, Browntown; Wesley, Beloit, and Vere, at home. Her mother, Mrs. William Qualley, Attica; one brother, William Qualley, Exeter, and two sisters, Mrs. Verna Gaarder, Janesville, and Miss Thelma Qualley, Attica, also survive. Short funeral services will be held at the home in Browntown Sunday, and at the church at Attica Sunday afternoon. Burial will be at Attica—Monroe Evening Times, July 6.
