James Dooley, Dayton, Killed in Car Crash; Companion Injured

James Dooley, 51, Dayton, Wis., was killed and Willard Fritz, 31, Belleville, was injured when their car overturned six and one-half times on county trunk A between Oregon and Belleville late Tuesday.

Dooley was driving the new car down a hill and lost control of the machine. Officer H. A. Gerry of the highway police said that from the point where the driver lost control to that where the car stopped was 513 feet. The car turned end over end three times and overturned sideways two and one-half times, the policeman said. The driver was thrown 35 feet out of the car.

Dooley and Fritz were taken to a Madison hospital, where Dooley died 20 minutes after admission. Fritz was confined today to St. Mary's hospital here with an arm injury and other lacerations.

The car was owned by Fritz's brother, who loaned it to the men to drive to Belleville. The demolished sedan had been driven only 1,175 miles.

Dooley is survived by his mother, with whom he made his home, and a sister, Frances.

Funeral services will be held at 9:30 a. m. Friday in St. James church in Dayton, the Rev. Mr Schafer, Belleville, officiating.
