

Eugene Harold Dooly

May 31, 1901 - Aug. 10, 1921

Eugene Harold Dooly, mention of whose untimely death was made in these columns last week, was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. James Dooly and a native of this vicinity, having been born on the old homestead farm, one and one-half miles east of Monticello, on May 31, 1901. With the exception two or three years, during which he resided near Brodhead, practically all of his life had been spent on the farm where death overtook him.

Eugene Dooly was a young man who was well thought of in the community because of his exemplary habits and industrious disposition. He was one of those manly young fellows whose every day life was indicative of his ambition to get ahead in the world and during his comparatively short span of life he proved himself in every way worthy of the confidence and esteem of a large circle of acquaintances. To have him cut down just as he was entering upon a life of usefulness was indeed a crushing blow to the bereaved family, all of whom have the heartfelt sympathy of the entire community in their sad affliction.

The remains were taken to Albany for burial on Friday morning, Aug. 12, where funeral services were held at the Catholic church. An unusually large number of relatives and friends were in attendance at the last sad rites and many beautiful floral tributes were in evidence.
