He was a kind husband and father, and a good neighbor, and will be greatly missed by those friends and neighbors who have known and associated with him for more than a third of a century.

In their great bereavement the family have the sympathy of all.

The funeral took place on Friday. The remains were taken to Dayton, followed by a large concourse of friends and neighbors, where they were laid down to an eternal rest in the Catholic cemetery near that village. May he rest in peace.
