## Mrs. Anna Eckburg 1893 - 1960

Mrs. Eckburg, wife of the former president of the Borden Cheese Co. died at a Sheboygan hospital Monday after a long illness. She was a native of Monticello and a former Monroe resident.

The Eckburgs have been residing at 245 Mead avenue in Plymouth since Mr. Eckburg retired from the Borden Co. last year. He was assistant to the president at the time of retirement and had served as president of the Borden Cheese Co. and executive vice president of Borden Co.

Mrs. Eckburg, the former Anna Zimmerman, was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Tomas Zimmerman of Monticello. After graduation from high school, she received teacher straining at Stevens Point College and taught home economics at Brodhead and Verona high schools.

She and Mr. Eckburg were married Sept. 24, 1925 at Rockford and resided here three years while he managed the Acherman Emmenegger and Co. cheese firm. In 1928, he was transferred to the Plymouth headquarters of Lakeshire-Marty co. of which he became president.

After his transfer to the New York Borden headquarters, they resided in an apartment hotel for several years. In 1949 the Eckburgs built a home at 2229 15<sup>th</sup> street where they resided for two years. Mr. Eckburg commuted by plane between Monroe and New York.

They sold their Monroe home in 1951 to Mr. and Mrs. Otto A. Wirz and moved back to New York.

Mrs. Eckburg was a member of the Woman's Club of Plymouth, St. Omar Eastern Star Chapter of Monroe, and Zwingli United Church of Christ at Monticello.

In addition to her husband, she leaves three sisters, Mrs. Fred Haddinger of Ft. Atkinson and Mrs. Henry C. Elmer and Mrs. Leon Voegeli of Monticello.

Memorial services will be conducted tomorrow at 7:30 p.m. in the Wittkopp funeral home at Plymouth by Rev. Robert smith, asocial at St. Paul's Episcopal church. There will be no visiting hour.

The body will be brought to Zwingli church in Monticello for services tomorrow at 2 p.m. with Rev. J. Allan Mittler, the new pastor, officiating. Burial will be in Monticello Cemetery.
