Body of Mrs. Henry Elmer, St. Louis, Former Resident Brought Here

The remains of Mrs. Henry Elmer, aged about 81, St. Louis, Mo., for many years a resident of Monticello, whose death following a long period of poor health occurred at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning in the home of her daughter, Mrs. Edward Kachelhoffer), St. Louis, arrived in Monticello this noon accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Kachelhoffer and son, Edward. Her son, Henry Elmer, with Mrs. Elmer and their daughters, Mary and Ramona, arrived here today by auto from their home in Kansas City.

Funeral services will be conducted here at 1:30 tomorrow (Friday) afternoon in the home of her son, Jacob H. Elmer, and at 2 o'clock in the Reformed church. Rev. A. Muehlmeier will officiate and burial will be in the Railroad avenue cemetery.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Baltz Disch, Mrs. Elmer, whose maiden name was Anna Disch, was born in Switzerland May 29, 1848. Her marriage to Henry Elmer took place in her native country. The couple came to America in the early 80's, and for many years resided on the farm now owned by their son, Jacob H. Elmer.
