

Anna Gerber

Dec. 30, 1886 - Jan. 7, 1974

A Monticello resident for 60 years, Mrs. Anna Gerber, 87, died at 6:45 a.m. today, Monday, Jan. 7, in St. Clare Hospital. She had been a patient three weeks for a heart condition.

The former Anna Boppert was born in Bruggen, St. Gallen, Switzerland, Dec. 30, 1886, a daughter of Casper and Anna Zeller Boppert. She attended schools in Switzerland and came to America in 1904, settling in New Glarus. On Sept. 25, 1906, she married Charles Gerber, in Monroe with the late Rev. P. A. Schuh of St. John's Church officiating. They lived in Monroe until moving to Monticello in 1913.

Mr. Gerber, who died March 22, 1937, was a barber and had a shop in Monticello more than 20 years.

Mrs. Gerber was a member of Grace Missionary Society of Monticello.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Arnold (Elisabeth) Zueger, Winslow, Ill.; four grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.

Two brothers, two sisters and her parents are deceased.

Services for Mrs. Gerber will be at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 10 in Newcomer Funeral Home of Monroe. Officiating will be Father Wilfred Shea of St. Victor's Catholic Church and Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, Monticello, retired United Church of Christ minister. Burial is to be in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
