

Juliette Gisler

March 19, 1891 - September 7, 1979

Mrs. Juliette Gisler, 88, Mt. Pleasant Township, Monticello, died Friday, Sept. 7, following a short illness.

She was admitted to St. Clare Hospital, Monroe on Aug. 31.

A native of Bozingen, Canton Bern, Switzerland, she was born March 19, 1891, the daughter of Johann and Sophie Hugli Burki. She was educated in Switzerland and came to the United States in 1909, settling in Washington, D. C., where she was a dressmaker. She moved to Monroe in the early 1920's, and was married to Franz Gisler on March 1, 1921, at St. John's Church, Monroe, by the late Rev. P. A. Schuh. She lived in Sylvester Township and Monroe, and since the death of her husband on May 23, 1961, she has resided in an apartment on the farm home of her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Wallace K. Feldt.

She was a member of the G.U.G.G. Lodge, Monroe, a former member of the Moose Lodge, St. John's Ladies Aid and the Dutch Hollow Homemakers.

Survivors include her daughter, Mrs. Feldt, and one grandson, Scott W. Feldt. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband and seven brothers and sisters in Switzerland.

Private graveside services were conducted Tuesday, Sept. 11, at Greenwood Cemetery in Monroe. Rev. Charles G. Workman of the Zwingli United Church of Christ officiated.
