

Clarence Gould

March 24, 1881 - Dec. 16, 1974

Monticello's oldest male resident, Clarence Gould, 93, a former member of the Green County Board of Supervisors from Exeter Township, died at 7:55 a.m. today, Monday, Dec. 16, in the New Glarus Home. He had been there since Aug. 13 and in failing health the past year.

With the exception of a year in the West and two years in Beloit, Mr. Gould had always lived in Green County. In 1901 he went to Havre, Mont., and the state of Oregon to work. He then worked in a Beloit foundry, but spent most of his working lifetime farming. He retired and moved to Monticello in 1947. Of late years he lived with his daughter, Mrs. Mildred Taylor, Monticello. A son, Howard, is on the home farm, rural Belleville.

He was born March 24, 1881, in Belleville and attended Belleville schools. He married Emma Edwards on Feb. 25, 1902, in Freeport. They farmed for 31 years, Mrs. Gould died Oct. 23, 1958.

Mr. Gould was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. For many years he was associated and keenly interested in the Exeter Cemetery Assn. Mr. Gould had a wealth of historical background of Exeter, Dayton, and those areas.

Surviving are the daughter and son; a brother, William, in South Dakota; 12 grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren, and seven great-great-grandchildren.

Three brothers and a sister preceded him in death.
