Fred Haldiman, 77, Dies Suddenly; Hold Rites on Wednesday Former Area Farmer is Victim of Cerebral Hemorrhage

Funeral services for Fred Haldiman, Sr., 77 years of age, Monroe, a former farmer just east of Monticello, who died at 10:50 Sunday morning at the home of his son, Fred Haldiman, Jr., residing between Monticello and New Glarus, were held at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday in Immanuel church, Monroe.

The Rev. Howard L. Orians, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

Mr. and Mrs. Haldiman had gone to the home of their son Saturday to remain several days while their son and daughter-in-law were gone. The junior Haldimans and Mr. and Mrs. Conrad Stauffacher had spent Saturday night in Baraboo and had planned to drive to Milwaukee Sunday to spend a few days.

Mr. Haldiman was helping with the chores on the Stauffacher Bros. farm when he complained of not feeling well. He was taken to the house, where he passed away a short time later as the result of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Native of Switzerland

A native of Switzerland, Fred Haldiman was born in Canton Bern, May 3, 1874, the son of Mathias and Elizabeth Schneider Haldiman. He came to America in 1895 and settled in Monroe. He was united in marriage to Hannah Losberger, the ceremony taking place in Monroe March 5, 1903. Mr. Haldiman was a cheesemaker from 1895 to 1904, after which he farmed near Monroe and also for 18 years just east of Monticello. They retired in 1946 and moved to Monroe.

Mr. Haldiman had been a member of the Immanuel Evangelical church for over 50 years and was a member of the Faithful Workers Sunday school class.

Surviving are the widow; three daughters, Miss Zelma, at home, Mrs. Erwin Spring, Monroe, and Mrs. Merlein Feind, Appleton; one son, Fred, Jr. Monticello; and three grandchildren. He was preceded in death by three brothers, John, Emil and Ernest, and two sisters in Switzerland,
