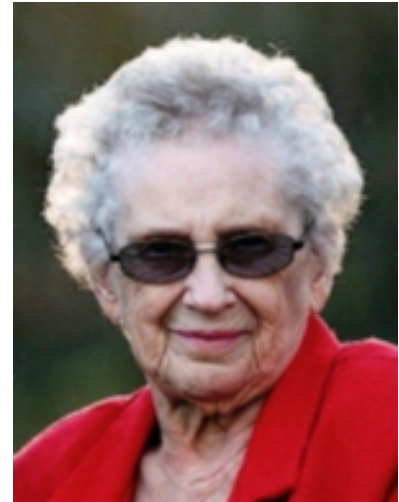


Betty A. Hardyman
