Leo W. Hauri, 44, Monroe, son of Mrs. Alice Hauri, Monroe, former Monticello resident, was killed in a motorcycle-car accident near Footville on Sunday, June 13, 1982.

He was born in Monticello on Oct. 27, 1937, the son of Walter and Alice Abbott Hauri. A graduate of Monticello High School, he was married on July 28, 1957 to Janet Kubly, in Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. He attended the UW-Platteville and also completed a number of extension courses with the National Guard and the Police Department.

He was a long-time member of the Monroe Police Department, where he was a court officer. He joined the Monroe police force in 1961, leaving the department on military leave with the 32nd Division, Wisconsin National Guard, for the Berlin call-up. He resumed duty with the police on his return.

Hauri was a master sergeant in the National Guard, enlisting in 1953, with Co. K., 128th Infantry, in Monroe. He was awarded the Army commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, the Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, and the National Guard Service Ribbon.

Survivors include his wife, Janet; two sons, Paul L. Hauri, Madison, and William with the US. Army in West Germany, and his mother, Mrs. Alice Hauri, Monroe. His father died June 29, 1977.

Private family services were held Wednesday, June 16, in the Newcomer Funeral Home, Monroe. Rev. Thomas Campion, chaplain at St. Clare Hospital officiated. Burial was in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.

A memorial fund has been established in his memory for the Monroe Police Department.
