

## **Esta Indergand**

**Dec. 9, 1899 - June 20, 1984**

Mrs. David (Esta) Indergand, 84, of 804 Ninth St., died unexpectedly at about 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 20, 1984, in her home.

The former Esta Elisabeth Rufer was born in Washington Township, Green County, Dec. 9, 1899, the daughter of Ulrich and Rosina Isely Rufer. She attended the Purcell rural school.

Her marriage to David A. Indergand took place Nov. 25, 1920, in Monticello. They farmed in Monroe Township until moving to Monroe in November of 1970. Mr. Indergand died June 18, 1978.

Surviving are two sons, Raymond Indergand, Route 4, and Delbert of Route 3; two daughters, Mrs. William (Lucile) Grossen, Route 1, Belleville, and Mrs. Glen (Charlene) Flannery, Route 4.; 16 grandchildren, 25 great-grandchildren, a brother, Ewald Rufer, and a sister, Mrs. Frank (Elda) Hartwig, both of Monroe.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, four brothers, Albert, Carl, Raymond and Wilhelm, and two sisters, Mrs. Ed (Flora) Gempeler and Mrs. Charles (Bertha) Marty.

The deceased was a member of the Washington Reformation United Church of Christ, the Monroe Golden Age Club of which she was a past president, and the Senior Recreation Band. The name submitted by Mrs. Indergand was selected for the naming of the Cheese City Social Center where she was actively involved, including its craft shop.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday in the Washington Reformation Church. The Rev. Steve Pedersen will officiate. Interment will be in Greenwood Cemetery, Monroe.
