Minnie Jordan Dies in Oregon

BROOKLYN (Special) — Services for Mrs. Minnie Jordan, 98, lifelong resident of the Brooklyn-Belleville area, will be held at 2 p. m. tomorrow in the Brooklyn Methodist church. Rev. Newton Barrett will officiate and burial will be in East Dayton cemetery. She died yesterday at an Oregon convalescent home.

Mrs. Jordan, the former Minnie Prucie, was born in Dayton Oct. 28, 1856, the daughter of a cooper who made barrels for flour milled at Dayton.

She was married in 1870 to Volne Jordan and they homesteaded land near North Platte, Neb. Crop failures due to grasshoppers and fear of Indian trouble drove them back to Wisconsin.

Her husband died in 1891 and she operated a boarding house in order to care for her four children. She retired to a home in Belleville in 1930.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Sidney Trow, Brooklyn; two sons, Frank, Brooklyn, and Harry, Belleville; three grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren, and a brother, Frank Prucie, Phoenix, Ariz.
