

**Edwin S. Kennedy**  
**May 24, 1911 - Sept. 24, 1983**

Services for Edwin S. Kennedy, 72, 766 S. Gammon Rd., Apt. 103, Madison. formerly of Monticello, will be held on Wednesday, Sept. 28 at 11 a.m. in the Zwingli UCC Memorial Lounge. Monticello. The Rev. Charles Workman will officiate with interment in Highland Cemetery.

Kennedy died at 6 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 24, 1983, in Madison General Hospital. Death resulted from a heart attack suffered a short time earlier at his home.

Kennedy was born in Monticello, May 24, 1911, the son of Charles D. and Blanche Richards Kennedy. He graduated from Monticello High School in 1929. His marriage to Florence O. Blum took place in Monticello, on February 14, 1931.

They made their home in Monticello for 10 years and then lived in Platteville and Milwaukee until moving to Madison in 1949. Mr. Kennedy was a retired tool and die maker, working with the UW-Madison Research Department. He retired in 1976 and moved to Apache Junction, Arizona, in 1977 and returned to Madison in 1982.

Survivors are his wife, Florence; two sons, Charles D. of Madison and Patrick S. of Middletown, N.Y.; a brother, Howard D. Kennedy, Monticello, and two grandchildren.

His parents and a brother, Kenneth, preceded him in death.

While residing in Monticello, he was a member of its volunteer fire department. He had served as a Cub Scoutmaster at Platteville and was a "volunteer father" with the Madison Drum and Bugle Corps.
