**Sept. 30, 1887 - April 1966**

**Henry F. Kubly, 78, Monroe, Dies; Rites Held Monday P. M.**

Funeral services for Henry F. Kubly, 78 years of age, a retired Monroe carpenter and former resident of Mt. Pleasant township, who passed away at 9:50 a. m. at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, where he had been a medical patient since early in February, were held at 1:30 p. m. Monday, (*April 18*) in St. John's United Church of Christ, Monroe.

The Rev. Calvin Fischer, pastor, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe.

Pallbearers were Ray Heinzelman, John Haldiman, Joe Rast, Leo L. Hofmeister, William Haren, and Nelson Schwend, all of Monroe.

Mr. Kubly was born in Jordan township on Sept. 30, 1887, the son of Abraham and Maria Baebler Kubly. He attended the Clarno school and also the Silver rural school in Mt. Pleasant township.

On Nov. 25, 1909, he was united in marriage in Monticello to Elizabeth Freitag, the Rev. A. Muehlmeier performing the ceremony. The couple farmed in Mt. Pleasant township, about two miles east of Monticello, for 10 years before moving to Monroe, where he had resided for 47 years. He was employed by the Green County Lumber and Fuel Co. at Monroe for 24 years as a carpenter and later by the Heinzelman construction firm at Monroe until his retirement.

Mr. Kubly was a member of St. John's United Church of Christ, Monroe.

He is survived by his wife; a brother, John Kubly, Monroe; and three sisters, Mrs. Matt H. Wittenwyler and Mrs. Walter Wittenwyler, both of Monticello, and Mrs. Marion Swann, Attica.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers, Abraham, Monticello, Conrad, Evansville, and Daniel, and a sister, Mrs. Henry Dooley, Monticello.
