

**Jon H. Lehnherr**  
**July 26, 1941 - Oct. 6, 1990**

Jon H. Lehnherr, 49, N6253 Silver Road, Monticello, died Saturday, Oct. 6, 1990, in an auto accident in Middleton near Wisconsin 12.

He was born July 26, 1941, at Monroe, the son of Harold F. and Thelma R. (Reuber) Lehnherr, and graduated from Monticello High School.

He married Nancy Herlien in 1963. He then married Marilyn Chadwick Dec. 16, 1989, in Las Vegas.

He entered the service Dec. 28, 1960, at Milwaukee, and was discharged Dec. 12, 1963, at Dover Air Force Base, Delaware. He was an airman first class in the U. S. Air Force and served with the 1607th Maintenance Squadron. He served overseas for one year and six months.

He re-enlisted Dec. 13, 1963, at Dover Air Force Base and was discharged Dec. 12, 1967, from Ent Air Force Base, Colorado. He was a sergeant in the U. S. Air Force and served in Vietnam. He was awarded the Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, the National Defense Service Medal with one bronze star, the Republic of Vietnam Commendation Medal, the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award and the Air Force Commendation Medal.

Mr. Lehnherr worked for Monroe Ready Mix, the Wisconsin School for the Visually Handicapped, and as a truck driver, most recently for Wisconsin Farm Lines, Wisconsin Dells.

He was a member of the Vietnam Veterans Chapter Three, the American Legion Post in Monticello and Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. He was currently a staff sergeant E6 in the National Guard.

Surviving are: his wife, Marilyn at home; his mother, Thelma Lehnherr, Monticello; sons Thomas and Todd Lehnherr, Monticello, Troy Lehnherr of Monroe, Rick Lehnherr and Jonathan Chadwick, both at home; daughters Teri Lehnherr, Monroe, and Marita Chadwick at home; four brothers, James, Monroe, Jerry, Madison, Josef and Jacob, both Monticello; and six sisters, Janice Kemp of Beloit, Gloria Jean Anderson of Belleville, IL., Mrs. Norman (Judith) Teubert of Darien, Mrs. Gary Jayne) Gilbertson of Wisconsin Dells, Mrs. Robert (Joyce) Holverson of Monticello and Mrs. Harold (Joan) Legler of New Glarus.

He was preceded in death by his father, Harold, Oct. 13, 1980; and a sister, Jill.

Funeral services are 11 a.m. Wednesday at Zwingli United Church of Christ, with the Rev. Erwin Pegel officiating. Burial is in Highland Cemetery.
