

**John Lewis**  
**October 25th, 1848 - March 29, 1926**

John Lewis was born in Mt. Pleasant township, Green county, Wis., on October 25th, 1848, being the year in which Wisconsin was admitted into the Union as a state. He died at his home on March 29, 1926.

He received his education in the home school after which he attended the Evansville Seminary and the school at Brodhead.

On Feb. 17, 1875, he was united in marriage to Helen Ross of Attica, who preceded him in death 10 years ago. To this union twelve children were born, five of whom have died. There are surviving: Idell, Pearl, Lester and Hazel who are at home; Albert of Albany township, Mrs. D. C. Staley of Brooklyn township, and Mrs. Thomas C. Hefty of near Monticello.

One brother, Theophilus, and six grandchildren also survive.

Mr. Lewis was a public spirited man, twice elected assessor and twice treasurer of Mt. Pleasant township. He was for 36 years clerk of the school district.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Albany Chapter, and of the Attica Chapter of the Woodman Lodge.

Services were held on Wednesday at 11 a.m. and were conducted by Rev. (undecipherable).
