Mrs. John Loeffel, 75, Former Village Resident, is Stricken

Funeral services for Mrs. John Loeffel, 75 years of age, Monroe, a former Monticello resident, who died Thursday in the St. Clare hospital after suddenly suffering a stroke at her home the evening before, were held at 1:30 p.m. Monday in Immanuel United Methodist church, Monroe, which she attended.

The Rev. Melvin J. Roehrdanz, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery, Monticello.

Martha Golz was born May 21, 1894, in Brooklyn township, a daughter of William and Louise Golz. On Nov. 22, 1913, she was united in marriage to John J. Loeffel, the ceremony taking place in the Dutch Hollow Evangelical church. Mr. and Mrs. Loeffel farmed in the Monticello area for 25 years before retiring to the village in 1938. Mr. Loeffel died in Monticello on June 14, 1951, and the following year Mrs. Loeffel moved to Monroe.

She is survived by six daughters, Mrs. Chester Ladwig, Mrs. Fritz Schild, and Mrs. Wallace Miller, Monroe; Mrs. Lester A. Witt, Route 4, Monroe; Mrs. Ervin Coplien, Albany, and Mrs. Richard Hefty, Lake Mills; three sons, Harvey and Manuel, Monroe, and Edward, Mt. Horeb; a brother, Elmer Golz, Evansville; 25 grandchildren, and 14 great-grandchildren.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by a son, Armin, Monticello, in 1960; a daughter, Carol, in infancy; two brothers, John and William Golz, and two sisters, Mrs. August Krause and Mrs. Fred Beyers.
