Oct. 19, 1887 - March 31, 1968
Mrs. Long, 80, Monticello, Dies

MONTICELLO (Times Special)—The death of Mrs. Truman Long, 80, a widow who lived alone, was discovered yesterday afternoon when relatives from New Glarus investigated after she had failed to answer her telephone and had not contacted the family of her sister, Mrs. Henry D. Hoesly, New Glarus.

Mrs. Long had died late Sunday night of an apparent heart attack.

She was the former Rachel Blum, a native of Washington Township and a daughter of Henry and Kathryn Blum. She attended Voegeli rural school.

On Dec. 6, 1922 she was married in Rockford to Truman Long. They farmed in Spring Grove Township, Green County, for two years and then moved to the Durand - Rockford area to farm from 1924 until March 1, 1950. They then retired and moved to Monticello. Her husband died Nov. 5, 1959.

Mrs. Long is survived by a brother, George Blum, Woodstock, Ill., and a sister, Mrs. Ernest Dahler, New Glarus. She was preceded in death by five brothers: Nick and Henry the latter in 1948, and both in Iowa; Ed, Oct. 27, 1958; Fred A., Aug 24, 1959, and John G. July 14, 1964; a sister in infancy and Mrs Henry D. Hoesly, and her parents. Funeral services for Mrs. Hoesly were held today in New Glarus.
