MRS. WILLIAM LOUGHEAD, 71, DIES; RITES TUESDAY

Albany.—(Times Special Service) — Funeral services for Mrs. William Loughead, aged 71, of Chokio, Minn., native of Attica vicinity, who died Saturday morning in Chokio following a short illness, will be conducted at 1 Tuesday afternoon in the Allen funeral home, Evansville. Rev. C. E. Burdon, pastor of the Albany and Attica Methodist church, will officiate. Burial will be at 2 o'clock in the Attica cemetery with short services at the grave. The body will arrive by train in Evansville Tuesday morning.

Lillian Bartlett, daughter of Joseph and Eliza Pryce Bartlett, pioneer settlers of Attica, was born Jan. 22, 1868 in the Attica vicinity. Her marriage to William Loughead occurred 48 years ago. They lived in Attica and Belleville vicinity and then moved to Plover, Ia., for 13 years before going to Chokio, Minn., where they have been for 35 years. She was a member of the Chokio Methodist church. She had visited in Albany about four years ago. Surviving are the widower; one daughter, Miss Gladys Loughead, Chokio, a teacher in the schools there; and two sisters, Mrs. Ralph Swann and Miss Gertrude Bartlett, Attica. She was preceded in death by her father in 1916; her mother in 1920; two brothers, four sisters, Mrs. John Nye and Mrs. Elizabeth Qualley, Attica Mrs. Emeret Davis, Albany, and Mrs. Fayette Jipson, Moneta, Ia.

Pallbearers will be six nephews: Dempster Davis, Albany; Newton Davis, Evansville; William Qualley, Marion Swann and Romayne Bartlett, Attica; and Stephen Swann, Oregon.
