Michael Moser, 84, Expires in Hospital Aged Resident of Village Summoned; Services Conducted

Funeral services for Michael Moser, 84 years of age, a highly esteemed resident of the Monticello vicinity for more than half a century, who passed away at 7:40 Monday morning in the Deaconess hospital, Monroe, following an illness of several months' duration, were conducted at 2 yesterday (Wednesday) afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home.

Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, pastor of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, officiated. Burial was in Highland cemetery.

Mr. Moser first became ill several months ago and had been bedfast for the past five months. Advancing years was given as the contributing factor in his death.

Native of Switzerland

Mr. Moser was a native of Switzerland, having been born in Alsace-Lorraine Aug. 20, 1854. He came to America at an early age and settled near Monroe, following the vocation of farming. He was united in marriage in Monroe to Susan Zimmerman, the ceremony taking place about 55 years ago. For many years Mr.S and Mrs. Moser farmed a short distance northeast of Monticello. They retired about 20 years ago and built a home just north of the east village limits, turning the operation of their farm over to a son, Fred.

Surviving, besides the bereaved widow are two sons, Fred W. Moser, Monticello, and Peter Moser, Pittsville; three daughters, Mrs. Royal Wasrud, Iola, Wis. Mrs. Rudy J. Schilt, Monroe, and Mrs. Henry H. Freitag, New Glarus; one brother, Peter Zimmerman, Monticello; and nine grandchildren.
