

Mrs. Robert Naylor

Feb. 18, 1909 - June 7, 1978

Mrs. Robert H. Naylor, 69, Parkwood Place, Jackson, Miss., died Wednesday, June. 7, 1978, in a hospital in Jackson. She had fractured her hip and also suffered a stroke.

Gladys M. Steinmann was born Feb. 18, 1909 in Monticello, the daughter of Fred H. and Elda M. (Marty) a partner in Karlen- Steinmann Lumber Co. She was a 1926 graduate of Monticello High School and a 1930 graduate of the Univ. of Wisconsin, Madison. She was a member of the Alpha Chi Omega Sorority and was married to Col. Robert H. Naylor on Aug. 7, 1937. At the time of their marriage, he was an assistant professor of military science at the U.W.- Madison. In 1939 they moved to Richmond, Va., and then to Columbus, Ohio. During World War Two, when Col. Naylor was in the Pacific theatre of operations, Mrs. Naylor and her family resided in Monticello. Following the war they joined Col. Naylor in Japan where he was with the Army of Occupation. They returned to the states and lived at Ft. Monroe, Va., and Camp Lejeune, N. Car.

After 30 years of service in the US. Army they retired to Jackson, Miss. She was a member of the Mississippi Gem and Mineral Society and was a member of the Jackson Chapter of the American Association. She and her husband owned and operated the Wise Bamboo Bookshop in Jackson.

Survivors are her husband; one son, Major Robert H. Naylor II, Tucson, Ariz.; one brother, Fred R. Steinmann, Elm Grove; one sister, Mrs. John (Kathleen) Potter, Madison, and six grandchildren.

Funeral Services will be conducted tomorrow (Thursday) June 15 at 3 p.m. in the Zwingli Church Memorial Lounge. The Rev. Charles G. Workman, church pastor, will officiate. Burial will be in the Highland cemetery, Monticello.
