NATIVE OF EXETER IS LAID TO REST

Death Comes to Mrs. James B. Norton (Alice M. Norton), Aged 56, of Monroe Feb. 16, 1871—1927

Mrs. James B. Norton, 56 years old, a native of Exeter township and a sister of John Lynn, of this village, passed away unexpectedly at her home in Monroe Thursday afternoon following a brief illness.

Death was due to hemorrhages from which she became very ill early Thursday morning. A few hours later she became unconscious and never recovered to the end. Her untimely death was a severe shock to relatives and friends, many of whom were unaware of her illness.

The deceased was a lifelong resident of Green county, having been born in Exeter township, Feb. 16, 1871, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lynn. On Feb. 14, 1901, she was united in marriage to James B. Norton and the couple moved to a farm near Clarno to reside. Prior to that she had resided in the community of her birth.

Mrs. Norton was formerly a school teacher and taught in several schools in this vicinity. At one time she was in charge of the Voegeli school, northwest of Monticello.

In 1913, the Nortons moved to Monroe to make their home. She had resided there ever since. The deceased was a member of St. Victor's Catholic church and was one of the first Monroe officers of the Catholic Daughters of America. She had also served as president of the Altar society.

Besides the husband, she is survived by two sons, Emmett, Monroe, and John, Chicago; one sister, Mrs. Henry Gale, Freeport; and three brothers, Henry Lynn, Coon Rapids, Iowa; John Lynn, of this village, and Alonzo Lynn, Monroe.

Funeral services were held in the Knight & Voelki funeral home, Monroe, at 9 o'clock Saturday morning and at 9:30 o'clock in St. Victor's Catholic church. Interment was in Calvary cemetery.
