

**Margaret Noth**  
**Sept. 19, 1857 - March 2, 1944**  
**Mrs. Margaret Noth Expires at 86 Years**  
**Esteemed Lady Called at Home of Son After Long Illness**

Monroe—Mrs. Margaret Noth, 86, died Thursday afternoon at the home of her son, John Wittwer, Mt. Pleasant township, after an illness of two years.

Mrs. Noth was born Sept. 19, 1857, in Washington township, the daughter of David and Mary Juggillard Tschabold. She was married Feb. 8, 1879, in New Glarus, to Jacob Wittwer, who preceded her in death.

On May 12, 1895, she married John Noth at Monroe. The couple resided near Monroe for several years before removing to Madison, where they made their home for 37 years. Since the death of her husband in 1936, Mrs. Noth had resided with her son, and with her daughter, Mrs. C. A. Tschabold, Fox Lake, Ill.

Surviving, besides the son and daughter, are 17 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren. Preceding her in death, besides Mr. Wittwer and Mr. Noth were two daughters, Mrs. Louise Grenzow, Monticello, and Mrs. Emma Meier, Madison, and a son, Sam Wittwer, Redwood Falls, Minn.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p. m. Sunday at the Shriner-Neushwander funeral home. The Rev. Paul C. Kehle, pastor of St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church, Monroe, of which she was a member, officiated, and burial services were held at 3:30 p. m. at Forrest Hill cemetery, Madison, following the rites at Monroe.
