Elizabeth Qualley, Life-long Resident Of Attica, Passes
Death Follows Number of Years of Failing Health

Mrs. Elizabeth Qualley aged 77, life-long resident of the Attica community, answered the final summons at 6 o'clock Tuesday evening, after an illness of about one week. While she had been in comparatively poor health for a number of years, it was not until recently that her condition became serious. While she suffered from complications, heart trouble is given as the immediate cause of her death.

Mrs. Qualley was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Bartlett, early settlers in the Attica community, and was born there on Jan. 6, 1856. She had spent all of her life within a mile or two of her birth place. Her marriage to William Qualley took place in Attica in 1875. They lived on a farm a short distance north of Attica for many years following their marriage. Subsequently they retired from farm life and moved to the village where Mr. Qualley conducted a general store for some years. Mr. Qualley passed away in 1905. A daughter, Miss Harriet, died in 1910, and another daughter, Mrs. Stanley Dietz, passed away in 1923. One son, Derwin, died in infancy.

Survivors are two daughters, Mrs. Verna Gaarder, Attica, and Mrs. Ralph Zimmerman, Juda, a son, William Qualley, Jr., Attica, and four sisters, Mrs. Ralph Swann, Miss Gertrude Bartlett, Attica, Mrs. Sarah Jipson, Moneta, Iowa, and Mrs. Lillie Laughead, Chokio, Minn. She also leaves several grandchildren.

Mrs. Qualley was a member of the Attica M. E. church.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow (Friday) afternoon at 1:30 at the home and at 2 in the Methodist church. Rev. W. C. Snow, Albany, will officiate and burial will be in the Attica cemetery.
