April 25, 1889 – October 1, 1962

Jac. Rhyner, Albany, Succumbs Monday

Funeral services for Jacob Rhyner, native of Mt. Pleasant township and resident of Albany for more than 20 years, who died at 12:50 p. m. Monday in his home at Albany at the age of 73 years, were held at 2 Wednesday afternoon in the Sharer funeral home, Albany.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, pastor of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, officiated, and burial was in Hillcrest cemetery, Albany.

Mr. Rhyner had been in ill health for a year or more.

He was born April 25, 1889, in Mt. Pleasant township, the son of Jacob and Sarah Freitag Rhyner. He attended Fairview school near his home. On Dec. 3, 1914, he was united in marriage to Mabel Krueger. They farmed in Mt. Pleasant township until 1939, retiring to Albany at that time.

Mr. Rhyner was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello.

He is survived by his wife; a son, William, rural Monticello; a daughter, Mrs. John Inabnit, rural Albany; five brothers, Alfred, Brodhead, Henry, Wilbert and Casper, Albany, and Lloyd, Mt. Horeb; four sisters, Mrs. Joe Blumer, Mrs. Henry Blumer, Mrs. Walter Pfeuti and Mrs. Herman Pluss, all of Mt. Pleasant township and the village of Albany, and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his father in May, 1935, and his mother, Oct. 21, 1948.
