

## Mrs. Rosina Rufer

One of Monroe's oldest residents, Mrs. Rosina Rufer, 98, formerly of 912 9th St., died at 3:30 p.m. yesterday in White Haven Nursing and Convalescent Home, Old Argyle Road. She had been a resident there the past five years, after her eyesight began to fade. Old-age: complications were fatal.

The former Rosina Iseli was born in Washington Township, Aug. 8, 1867, one of 14 children of Christian and Verena Bunker Iseli. She attended Washington schools. On Dec. 16, 1886 she was married in Monticello to Ulrich Rufer. They farmed in Washington Township until retiring to Monroe in 1925.

Mrs. Rufer, confirmed at Washington Reformation Church June 4, 1882, was an ardent worker in the church, taught Sunday school for many years, and also sang in the choir. She was a
