Two persons are being held in connection with his death, under investigation by Kenosha police.

He was born on the Schmid homestead farm in Adams township, Green County, Aug. 1, 1924. His parents were Christian E. and Bertha S. Stauffacher Schmid. He attended Monticello and Argyle schools.

He entered the US. Marine Corps on Nov. 21, 1942, going overseas on June 4, 1943, serving in the Asian Pacific theater. His service includes: Marine landings from New Guinea to Okinawa. He returned to the United States in December of 1945, being discharged as a corporal, April 5, 1946, at Great Lakes. Ill. Schmid was a self-employed carpenter and had lived in the Milwaukee and Kenosha areas since his discharge from military service.

Services were held Wednesday, Sept. 13 in the Newcomer Funeral Home, Monroe. Rev. Duane Mc Donough of the Washington Reformation Church officiated. Burial was in the church cemetery. Voegeli Funeral service was in charge of arrangements.
