**Oct. 7, 1870 - 1925**

**SCHULER FAMILY AGAIN TRAGEDY VICTIMS**

Within a few hours after her son, Wm. Schuler, tried to take his life, his mother, Mrs. John Schuler killed herself by slashing her throat at the home of her sister, Mrs. Otto Loveland near Monticello, Mrs. Schuler had not been informed of the attempted suicide of her son but it is thought that she suspected that something had happened and that she probably overheard the story at the telephone when she was left alone for a short time.

On Jan. 16, Mr. Schuler ended his life with a shot gun and since that time both the wife and son had been despondent. The son is principal of the Monroe Junior H. S. He is said to be recovering from a revolver scalp wound and a slashed wrist. The wounds were inflicted at his office during school hours. He is married and has two sons.

Mrs. Schuler was born on Oct. 7, 1870 in Washington Township as the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Moritz. In 1891 she was married to John Schuler. They had always lived near and at Monticello. Two sons John and William survive her. Also two sisters and three brothers.

Funeral services were held on Monday afternoon, with burial at Monticello. Rev. Muehlmeier conducted the services.
