MRS. LEMUEL SCHULTZ DIES

End Comes Sunday Evening After Long Illness

Mrs. Lemuel Schultz passed away at the family home on Railroad avenue shortly after 11 o'clock Sunday evening, her death being due to a cancer of the stomach with which she has been afflicted for a number of months. Mrs. Schultz had been in poor health for a period of years, though it was not until a few months ago that her condition became such as to deeply concern the immediate members of her family. Last November she submitted to an operation at the Madison General hospital and for a number of weeks thereafter was under treatment there. Recently she was again under treatment at the hospital, but all efforts to combat the disease proved unavailing and she had suffered a steady decline since her return from the hospital a little over two weeks ago.

Anna Babler was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Esis Babler and was born in the town of Mt. Pleasant, a short distance south of Monticello, on Sept. 25, 1863. She was baptized in November of the same year and her confirmation took place at Monroe on March 21, 1880.

Her marriage to Lemuel Schultz occurred on Dec. 30, 1883, and to this union two sons and two daughters were born.

Following their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Schultz lived at New Glarus for a period of five years. They then bought a farm in Mt. Pleasant township upon which they lived for the next fifteen years. In 1904 they moved to Monticello and five years later took up their home at Orfordville, returning to Monticello in 1914 to again make their home.

Mrs. Schultz was a woman of most congenial disposition and her many commendable qualities won for her the friendship and esteem of all with whom she came in contact. She was a faithful and devoted wife and mother and as a neighbor she was always kind and accommodating. In the great sorrow that has overtaken them the bereaved relatives have the sympathy of all.

Besides the bereaved husband she is survived by four children and twelve grandchildren. The children are Jacob and Isaac Schultz and Mrs. Albert Marty, of Monticello, and Mrs. Anna Walmer, of Albany. She is also survived by five sisters, one half-sister and one half-brother. The funeral was held from the home at 1 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, the services being conducted by the Rev. A. Muehlmeier. Burial was in Highland cemetery. A large concourse of relatives and friends were in attendance at the last sad rites, many being present from neighboring towns.
