

**Herman A. Schulz**  
**April 28, 1920 - August 9, 1980**

Herman A. Schulz, 60, rural Monticello, died unexpectedly Saturday evening, August 9. He was pronounced dead on arrival at a Madison hospital. He collapsed shortly after taking part in a fireman's water fight in Belleville as part of the Belleville Community Picnic.

He was born on the Schulz homestead farm in Mt. Pleasant Township on April 28, 1920, the son of Albert and Hedwig F. Ruenger Schulz. He attended Silver rural school and had farmed on the Schulz farm until 1955. He was then employed by construction firms in Monticello for eight years, and since 1963 had been employed as a farm implement mechanic for Studer Super Service Inc., Monroe.

A member of the Monticello Fire Department, he had taken part on the water fight team for many years.

Services were held Tuesday, Aug, 12, in Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. Rev. Charles G. Workman officiated and burial was in the church cemetery.

Survivors include three sisters, Mrs. Howard (Frieda) Gould, rural Belleville, and Mrs. Lawrence (Florence) Huntley and Mrs. Alice Albertson, both of Monticello.

Preceding him in death were his mother in 1950; his father in 1954, and two sisters, Mrs. Harold (Ella) Albertson in 1938 and Mrs. Louise Atkinson in 1978.

Active pallbearers were Wilbert Blumer, Gene Flescher, Jack Krieg, Jerry Klassy, Edwin Riese, Larry Strause, Dennis Truttman, and Steve Truttman, all members of the fire department. Honorary pallbearers included Charles E. Hefty, Arthur, Ray and William Silver and the other members of the Monticello Fire Department.

Voegeli Funeral service was in charge of arrangements.
