**July 17, 1894 – July 10, 1963**

**Wm. F. Spring, 68, Dies Suddenly; Rites Set for Saturday**

William F. Spring, 68 years of age, well known Monticello resident, died suddenly at 5:30 a. m. yesterday (Wednesday) of a heart attack in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, where he had been a patient since June 29.

He was born in Albany township, July 17, 1894, the son of Fred and Louise Lehnherr Spring, natives of Switzerland. When he was three years of age the family returned to Switzerland for seven years and it was there that he received his early education. On Feb. 11, 1915, he was united in marriage to Rose Bryner, the ceremony taking place in Neillsville. They farmed in Mt. Pleasant township for many years before retiring to the village in 1945.

**Held Public Offices**

Mr. Spring was a member of the Oak Shade school board for some years and served as Mt. Pleasant town chairman and county board supervisor for a term of years. He also represented the village of Monticello as county board supervisor for several terms.

Mr. Spring was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ, the Monticello Masonic lodge, Madison Consistory and the Zor Shrine.

He is survived by his wife; one daughter, Mrs. Fred Zurfluh, Albany; one son, Willis, Monroe; one brother, Alfred, Milwaukee; one sister, Mrs. Paul Veenje, Madison; 11 grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a grandson, Neil Zurfluh, in 1945, and one brother, Fred, Portage.

**Services Set for Saturday**

Funeral services will be held at 2 Saturday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ with the Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor officiating. Interment will be in Highland cemetery here.
