Funeral services for Willis I. Spring, 48 years of age, Monroe and a former Monticello area resident, who died at 4:15 a.m. last Thursday in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 1:30 Saturday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

From 1958 until 1968 they managed the Hill Top Inn, on the east side of Monroe. From 1968 until ill health force him to retire, he worked for the Wm. Rees Construction Co Monroe.
