

**Emil W. Stauffacher**  
**Nov. 7, 1879 - June 3, 1948**

Emil W. Stauffacher, 68, 2208 12th street, died suddenly at his home yesterday at 5 p. m. Death was caused by a blood clot.

Mr. Stauffacher was recovering from a four weeks illness at St. Clare hospital. He had returned to his home Tuesday.

Born in Sylvester township, Nov. 7, 1879, he was the son of Henry and Louisa Ebert Stauffacher. He attended North Central college at Naperville and business school in Monroe. He was married Jan. 1, 1906, at Schultz Station, north of Monroe, to Della V. Schultz.

After their marriage they farmed in Washington township for five years and in Sylvester township until retiring in 1928. They then moved to Monroe and have lived here since. He was employed at Roy's. Shell station, helping out.

Surviving are Mrs. Stauffacher, a son, Chester L. of Sylvester; two daughters, Mrs. B. Elwin Coon of Beloit, Mrs. George W. Kieffer of Middleton; four brothers, Benjamin F. of St. Paul, George L. of Sylvester township, Rev. Albert D. of White Plains, N. Y., and Harry W. of Long Beach, Calif.; and eight grandchildren.

Two children, Lester and Florence, two brothers, Edward and John, and a sister, Ida, preceded him in death. He was a member of the Union Presbyterian church.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. in Stuessy funeral home with Rev. L. C. Viel of the Immanuel Evangelical United Brethren church officiating. Burial will be in Dutch Hollow cemetery.
