Mrs. Aida Steinmann, 83, Stricken; Rites Held Here Saturday 1886 – 1969

Funeral services for Mrs. Alda M Steinmann 83 years of age, a resident of the Monticello community for more than 70 years, who passed away at 10 p.m. last week Wednesday at the New Glarus Home for Aged, were held at 2:30 Saturday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ Memorial Lounge here. Interment was in Highland cemetery.

Mrs. Steinmann had been a resident of the New Glarus retirement home since January, 1968, when her health began to fail. He condition had been critical for several weeks prior to her death.

Alda M. Marty was born in Luverne, Iowa, Feb. 6, 1886, the daughter of Jacob and Augusta Butts Marty. She came to Monticello at the age of 10 with her family and had always lived here since that time. Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by a son Donald, in 1915; two brothers, Fred and Willis J. Marty and one sister, Mrs. Henry C. (Minnie) Klassy.
