
## Edyth R. Stoll, 87, Former Teacher, Dies

Mrs. Edyth R. Stoll, 87, Monticello, died Wednesday, November 20, 1974, in Pleasant View Nursing Home, Monroe.

She was born April 23, 1887, in Washington Township, the daughter of Fred S. and Mary Schuler Blum. She attended Monticello and Monroe schools and attended summer sessions, and taught in Grade school in Brodhead and Monticello. Mrs. Stoll wrote a county examination for teachers when she was 14 years old and observed her 15th birthday teaching in the Purcell rural school. She later graduated from Stevens Point Normal, trained in Home Economics and taught in the Whitewater High School, returning to the Monticello system in 1918. She retired in the 1930's.





She was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, its Ladies Aid and the Missionary Society, the Royal Neighbors of American and was a member and Past Worthy Matron of the Order of the Eastern Star. She was a member of the White Shrine, and was Christmas Seal Chairman in Monticello for over 50 years.

She is survived by one brother, W. E. Blum, retired Monticello business man and bank president, and other cousins.

Her funeral was held Friday, November 22, at the Zwingli UCC, Monticello, with Rev. Charles Workman officiating. Burial was in the family lot in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
