**Herman F. Stoll, Monticello, Dies**

MONTICELLO — Herman F. Stoll, 74, died at 8 a.m. today at his home here from a heart condition. He had been ill for the past month.

Mr. Stoll was born in Mokena, Ill, Oct. 29, 1884, the son of Herman C. and Henrietta Schick Stoll. He attended grade and high school in Joliet and graduated from the LaSalle University extension in Chicago.

During World War I he attended officer's training school of the motor transport corps in Washington, D. C. He was a former general manager and assistant treasurer of the Schare Chicago Printing Co., Chicago and for seven years, before retirement, he was superintendent at the silica plant at Browntown. He retired several years ago.

Mr. Stoll was married Oct. 20, 1943, in Janesville to Edyth R. Blum of Monticello.

He was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ; Mount Joliet Lodge No. 42, F. and A.M., Joliet; Ansar Shrine, Springfield, Ill., Monroe Commandery; New Glarus Masonic chapter, Monticello Eastern Star and the Green County Shrine Club.

His hobby was growing flowers and he enjoyed landscaped activities.

Surviving are his wife; four sisters, Mrs. C. J. Sengenberger, Waukegan, Ill.; Mrs. G. C. Peterson, Mokena, Ill, and Mrs. Edward Porter and Mrs. George Wagner, both of Joliet, Ill. Three brothers are deceased: Walter O., Chicago; Charles S., Joliet, and Fred D., Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.
