## Julius Studer, Aged 52, Dies After Long Illness; Rites Held Former Restaurant Owner Here Dies in Home

Funeral services for Julius Studer, 52 years of age, former restaurant proprietor here, who passed away at noon on Wednesday of last week in his home on Highland street from complications, were held at 2:30 Friday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home here. Pallbearers were W. E. Blum, Arthur Escher, Henry J. Elmer, James F. Hancock, Ernest Schuerch and John Wittenwyler.

The Rev. W. F. Siemers, pastor of the Immanuel Evangelical and Reformed church, Darlington, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe.

Mr. Studer, who was forced to retire as operator of the Casino Cafe here last spring because of impaired health, had been failing for the past nine months or more.

## **Native of Switzerland**

Julius Studer was the son of Jacob and Barbara Mieffler Studer and was born in Switzerland May 2, 1896. He attended schools in Switzerland and came to the United States in 1920, settling in Rice Lake, where he took up the cheesemaking trade. In March, 1926, he was united in marriage to Jacobina Degenhart, the ceremony taking place in Chicago. The couple left Rice Lake in 1940, moving to Winslow, Ill, where they resided until 1947. They purchased the Casino Cafe here in 1947, operating the restaurant until April 15 of this year.

Survivors include his wife; four brothers, Fritz, Walter, Adolph and Hans, Switzerland; and three sisters, Mrs. Gottlieb Zulliger, Baron, Mrs. Ferdnand Stettler, McConnell, Ill, and Mrs. Marie Zimmerli, Switzerland. He was preceded in death by three sisters in Switzerland.
