Forrest Taylor, Monticello, Dies

Forrest L. Taylor, 65, Monticello, died at 2:30 a.m. today at his home. He had been suffering from a heart condition for the past year.

Mr. Taylor, son of George and Lucretia Ruhlmann Taylor, was born in Marshfield on May 8, 1904. He received his schooling in Wausau and in 1920 was married to Clara Heerli. Mrs. Taylor was killed in an accident in 1927 and he was married to Mrs. Mildred Lewis on July 26, 1934. He was employed by the Cheese Producers Marketing Association in Monroe and for the past eight years was employed by the P. W. Ryan Co. in Janesville. He has resided in Monticello since his second marriage.

Survivors include his wife, his mother, Mrs. Lucretia Taylor, Portage; three daughters, Mrs. Leo Meythaler, Brodhead; Mrs. Elmer Riese, San Jose, Calif., and Mrs. Lloyd Guerst, Rockford; four sons, George, Rolland and Sheldon, Monticello, and Elden, Brunswick, Ga.; three step-daughters, Mrs. Don Grady, Verona; Mrs. John Powlard, Washington, Kan., and Mrs. Harold Rufer, Monroe; one step-son, Donald Lewis, Cambria; two brothers, Harold, Westby, and Everett, Wisconsin Dells, four grandchildren and 12 step-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his father and his first wife.
