Paul E. Voegeli, 66, Monticello, well known Green County lawyer died at 2:45 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 13, 1980, in the Veterans Administration Hospital in Madison. He had been a patient there since Aug. 27.

Born in Washington Township, Green County, May 10, 1914, he was the son of Emil G. and Christie Lemon Voegeli. A 1931 graduate of Monticello High School, he graduated from the UW-Madison in 1936 and from the UW, Law School in 1939. He practiced law in New Glarus for three years following graduation.

His marriage to the former Josephine E. Blum took place May 9, 1942, in Monticello, the late Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, officiating.

He entered active military duty with the US. Army Air Corps May

26, 1942. He was sent to Europe in December of 1942 and assigned to the Intelligence Section of the Supreme Allied Headquarters in London. Discharged from active duty May 26, 1946, he remained a member of the US. Air Force Reserve. At the time of his death he held the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, Ret.

Mr. Voegeli returned to Green County following his discharge and established his law practice in Monticello where he continued to reside.

Survivors include his wife, Josephine; two sons, Paul W. Voegeli of New York, N. Y., and John E. of New Orleans, La; his father, Emil G. Voegeli, Monticello, presently residing at the New Glarus Home, and two sisters, Mrs. Robert (Marian D.) Taylor, Hilton Head Island, S. C, and Mrs. W. Robert (Phyllis) Koch, Madison.

His mother preceded him in death June 21, 1975.

The deceased was a member of the American Bar Association, Green County Bar Association, having served as president; the Amstutz-Marty American legion Post 256 of Monticello, the New Glarus Masonic Lodge and Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. He served on the Monticello School Board from 1948 to 1960 and from 1967 to 1970, serving as director of the board for eight years. He was currently serving as a Green County Court Commissioner.

Funeral rites will be held Sunday at 2 pm. in Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, the Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating. Burial will be in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
