Wm. A. Voegeli, Age 75, Dies Sunday Nite After Long Illness

Funeral services for William A. Voegeli, 75 years of age, Monticello, who died Sunday night in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, as the result of a stroke which he suffered on May 28 of this year, were held at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday at the Voegeli funeral home here. The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, pastor of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers—all nephews—were Royal Elmer, Richard Voegeli, New Glarus, Ralph Voegeli, Evansville, Gaylord Voegeli, Monticello, Harland Voegeli and Frederick M. Voegeli, Monroe.

He was hospitalized following the stroke and on Aug. 3 he was moved to the Monroe Manor nursing home. He had been readmitted to the hospital on Saturday.

He was born at Paoli on Sept. 29, 1890, the son of William and Regula Voegeli Voegeli. He came to Monticello as a small child with his parents and attended the local school. He lived in and around Monticello all of his life, working on area farms for many years. For several years before retiring he was employed by local construction companies,

Upon his retirement, “Bill” turned his attention to potato farming on a small scale, and the potatoes he produced from sheer waste land were the envy of all area gardeners.

Mr. Voegeli was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

He is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Werner Blumer, Monroe, and Mrs. John W. Elmer, New Glarus, and two brothers, Melvin, New Glarus, and Herman, Monticello.

He was preceded in death by his mother, Oct. 15, 1945, and his father, Sept. 25, 1947.
